To whom it may concern,

The City of Kenyon, Goodhue County, Minnesota was originally incorporated as a village on October 16, 1885. This is reflected in Harvey Walker's 1927 *Village Laws and Government in Minnesota* table on village incorporation records as being registered with the office of the Recorder of Deeds.

However, the State of Minnesota no longer uses the term "village" to describe its municipalities, pursuant to Minnesota Statute Chapter 412.016, subd. 2 (1973). As such, the municipality previously known as the "Village of Kenyon", Goodhue County, was redesignated as the "City of Kenyon", **effective January 1, 1974**. At present, the City of Kenyon is classified as a fourth-class, Plan-A statutory city.
